Yosemite National Park is not only a shining star of the U.S. park system, its preservation also gave birth to the entire concept of America’s national parks. Spread across nearly 750,000 acres of California wilderness, Yosemite lies within the Sierra Nevada mountain range, covered by the Sierra National Forest to the southeast and the Stanislaus National Forest in the northwest, interrupted by awe-inspiring granite peaks that jut into the sky. With its iconic El Capitan, the vertigo-inducing Half Dome, the blooming meadows, and giant sequoias, to visit is to understand why early settlers called it “God’s Cathedral.” Protection from commercial interests began in 1864, with Abraham Lincoln signing the Yosemite Grant, making the land federal property but available for public use. Still, road-building, homesteading, and overgrazing remained issues. Thanks largely to the efforts of naturalist John Muir, Yosemite became a California-controlled “national park” in 1890. The U.S. took it over in 1906, and it became part of the new National Park Service in 1916.

04. Interior: Finch Paper Opaque Smooth 60#T “Bright White,” with a fine, 1-color application of “Green Earth” soy-based Superior ink.
05. Bound with a Heidelberg Stitchmaster ST 270 5-pocket saddle stitcher.
06. Corners rounded to a 3/8” (9.5mm) radius with a Challenge round-corner machine.
07. Graph grid: 3/16” x 3/16” (4.7mm x 4.7mm).
08. Memo book dimensions are 3-1/2” x 5-1/2” (89mm x 140mm).
09. FIELD NOTES uses only the Futura typeface family (Paul Renner, 1927) in its materials.
10. ALL FIELD NOTES memo books are printed and manufactured in the U.S.A.
